Southeast Michigan Green Schools Initiative

Public Act 301 (2010) updated and revised P.A. 146 (2006), which established the Michigan Green Schools program. A public or private school in Michigan may apply to be designated a "Green School" by submitting the appropriate information to the county/intermediate school district in which the school is located. The intent of the Michigan Green Schools Program is to encourage students to participate in activities which help them learn about preserving natural resources, protect the environment, and promote energy efficiency and savings.

A school is eligible to receive a Green, Emerald or Evergreen school environmental stewardship designation when the school coordinator or students submits proper written documentation describing how the school has performed in a minimum of 10 energy saving and environmental activities.

At Defer the Green Squad leaders in grades 3 and 4 spearhead this work under the direction of two Defer parents, Sue Parlangeli and Kelly Woolums. Upon submitting our application last month we received the following email from the Southeastern Michigan Green School committee:

I received and reviewed your Michigan Green School activity verification. Congratulations! Because of the hard work from the teachers, students and parents, Defer Elementary School has received the 2016 Michigan Evergreen School designation, by completing at least 20 energy saving and environmental tasks. The efforts you made to complete the tasks are very impressive. I especially enjoyed learning about the outstanding participation in Defer's Green Squad and your Earth Day activities. I urge Defer Elementary School to continue with the energy saving and environmental tasks and hope you encourage others to follow.

Disability Awareness

Defer's fourth grade students had a very unique opportunity last week. The Grosse Pointe School District offers a full-day experience in which students are immersed in a learning opportunity about a variety of disabilities. Students operate a wheel chair and try to maneuver in the hallways and in and out of the bathroom. Students learned how hard it is read if you have dyslexia or what happens when you lose your voice box. They surveyed the Defer building to determine its accessibility for those with a handicap. Each experience helped these students not only gain a better understanding but to feel empathy for others. At the end of the day students reflected on their experiences and the following are a few of their thoughts about Disability Awareness Day.

Disability awareness

- Another thing I learned is that being handicapped is very tiring and that it is hard. I learned that dyslexia is not only the words change, but the pictures change too. It is not funny that people have disabilities. Gabby
- My hands hurt and I wanted to get up and stretch. At first I thought it would be fun but now I know it can also be hard to operate a wheelchair. Lina
- I learned that it is not fun to be in a wheelchair, here's why; first, you don't even feel your legs. Second, moving around gives you blisters and last, you have to go on a ramp to get in the school. That's why being in a wheelchair is no fun. (so don't break your legs on purpose!). I learned that reading braille is hard. Quincy
- I loved Disability Awareness Day mostly because I learned how many people can have a disability and it is tons. There are so many disabilities in the world. Gabriel
- I learned that people with dyslexia see weird, backwards. Sometimes they see colors differently and sometimes they need a little more time on tests. I also learned that the white cane helps people that are blind. It helps so they don't bump into stuff. Blind people also use braille so they can read and leader dogs that can lead them. - I learned that being in a wheelchair is not that fun. It is hard to move around corners. It also gives you blisters. Its hard to get in and out of rooms. I also learned it can be tiring to be in a wheelchair. Liam
- Disability Awareness Day was a fun experience for me! I learned that people with disabilities sometimes shake nonstop. They put us in their shoes and we used a shaking pen.
