

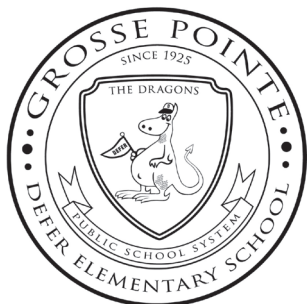

Dear Defer Families,

There is an easy way to improve your child's chances at school. It will entertain and delight him/her. It will strengthen the bonds between your child and you. And it is virtually free.

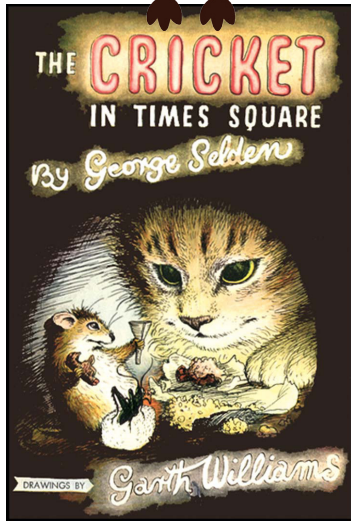
Sound too good to be true? Actually, it isn't. The magical method: taking time to read aloud to your child.

In an era of high-stakes testing and education reforms and revolutions, research has repeatedly proved that one simple parenting technique is among the most effective. Children who are read aloud to by parents get a head start in language and literacy skills and go to school every day better prepared.

In other words, reading that bedtime story may not only entertain Catherine, it may also develop her vocabulary, improve her ability to learn to read, and perhaps most important- foster a lifelong love of books and reading.

As Mr. Trelease, the author of *The Read Aloud Handbook* succinctly states, "Students who read the most, read the best, achieve the most, and stay in school the longest. Conversely, those who don't read much, cannot get better at it."





The good news for families is that this sage piece of parenting wisdom is easy to follow. Reading aloud to your child requires only a book – free, with a library card – and your willingness to spend a little quality time with your child. And while the sacrifices to read aloud are few, the benefits are many: Your child may learn to read better, think better, imagine more richly, and become a passionate and lifelong reader. More than these long-term benefits, however, are some more immediate benefits: The pleasure of spending time with your child and sharing the enjoyment of a good book.

March is National Reading Month and during the month we are asking all of our Defer families to participate in our One Book, One School family reading program. The Defer staff has selected *A Cricket in Times Square* by George Selden, and is very excited about this shared reading experience that will take place at home and at school during March.



So how does this work? One copy of *A Cricket in Times Square* was purchased through the generosity of two Defer supporters for each family at Defer. Each week families read the chapters assigned for the week and every Tuesday trivia questions will be read aloud during announcements. Other reading activities will take place during the school day. A specific schedule for daily reading will be included in the March newsletter as we start our One Book, One School experience. So get ready to start reading together!

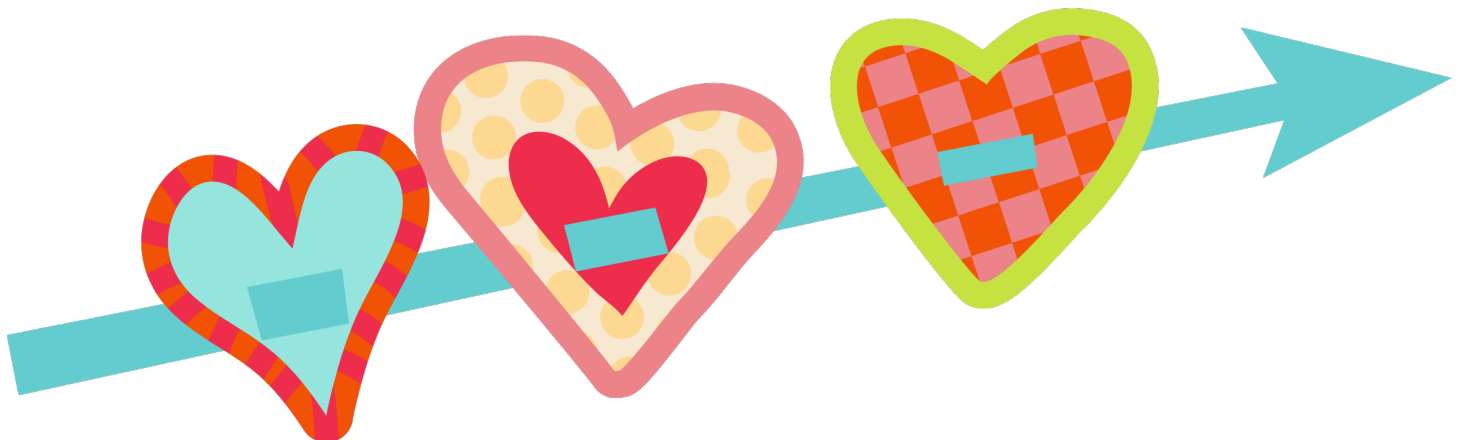

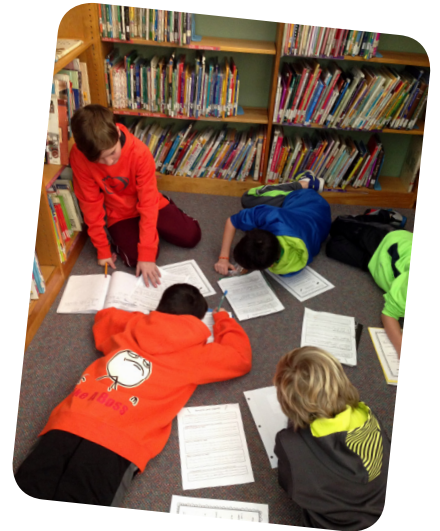
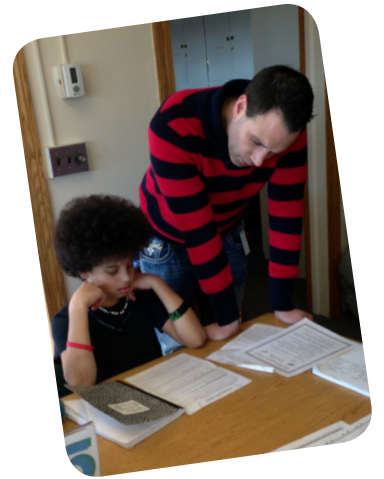


## BOY'S WRITING CLUB

The Boys' Writing Club is off to a great start with 58 students participating in grades 3-5 and 12 staff members volunteering their time! We began our club by creating a club handshake and having Kid President share his 20 Things We Should Do More Often.

Lately, we have been focused on persuasive letter writing about the Super Bowl. The Lions game in the snow prompted staff to think about whether or not football games should be played in those conditions again and transferred that thinking into a lesson for our boys. The boys began by forming opinions on whether or not football should be played in snowy, cold conditions. We brainstormed the pros and cons to both situations. Upon completion of our discussion, the boys formed their own opinion in order to write their persuasive letter to Roger Godell, the NFL commissioner. They had to write a persuasive statement in order to express their opinion, produce three pieces of evidence to back up their opinion, and write a conclusion statement to push Mr. Godell into action one way or another. Through this activity, we worked on forming opinions, backing them up with evidence, and formatting persuasive letters through those opinions.

During our sessions, boys are motivated to write while working on fundamental writing skills. This year, we hope to have guest speakers, utilize technology to improve our writing, and to show our boys how much fun writing can be when you think positively and proactively. ## POSITIVE BEHAVIOR INTERVENTIONS & SUPPORT (PBIS)

The PBIS program continues to be a backbone of Defer. It is based on the premise that all students can benefit from well implemented, evidence-based practices for improving student behavior. School-wide PBIS provides a positive focus to encourage desirable student behaviors. A set of universal expectations for behavior, positively stated, are established for all students in all locations of the school. These expectations generally promote core values such as respect, responsibility, and safety. Interventions and strategies are implemented to teach and reinforce these expectations. These include:

- Periodic direct instruction in specific student behaviors that demonstrate **respect**, **responsibility**, and **safety** in various locations in the school.
- Generous quantities of positive adult/teacher attention and other kinds of reinforcement to students for demonstrating positive behaviors, especially specific behavior expectations identified by the school.
- Predictable consequences for behavior infractions that are delivered consistently by all staff in a professional manner throughout the entire school.

Each month Defer school celebrates the good behavior of our students. The January PBIS party was entitled: Choose Your Own Adventure. Teachers each offered a unique activity in their classrooms and students signed-up for the one they were most interested in participating in as their Reward Party. Students selected from building snowman, to watching a movie, to playing bingo, or building a marshmallow and toothpick structure, and many more. Whatever the choice – a good time was had by all!

## On Line Registration is coming to GPPSS elementary schools in 2014

All Defer parents, Is your e-mail current with the school district? Like our secondary schools, the elementary schools are moving to a mandatory online pre-registration for all Grosse Pointe Public School students next school year. Your “access key” for the online pre-registration will be coming to you this summer via your current e-mail that is on file with the school district.

If you need to update your e-mail with the school district, log in to Parent Portal and click on “My Information” in the upper right corner.

You can also e-mail Parent Connect@gpschools.org from your email we have on file, or call 313-432-3131 from the phone number in our records so we can verify who you are, and provide:

- your name
- child’s name
- present school name and
- your old and new e-mail address as soon as possible.

We are asking families to do this by February 1 to ensure you receive registration communications in a timely manner. However, we always seek to have your most current contact information on file in case of emergency.

If you do not have an email address or access to a computer, please know that our school computer labs will be open and stations are available at the administration building, 389 St. Clair Avenue, to complete the online registration process.

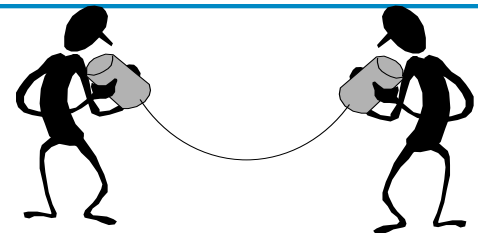

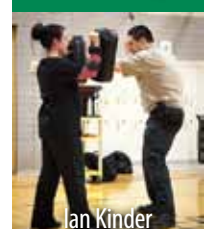

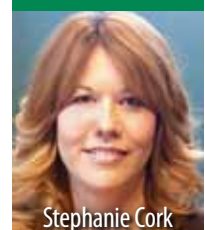
