### W.I.G.

#### Wildly Important Goals

This year as part of our School Improvement Plan at Defer each grade established a WIG goal. The goal was based on studying student assessment data and looking specifically at a set of skills that students have not mastered at that grade. As the school year comes to an end I'd like to share how we did with our goals. We're proud!!!

#### **Kindergarten Wig:**

Goal: 85% of the Kindergarten students will recognize all 56 sight words by June 2017, or show growth toward meeting that goal.

Results: 86% of our Kindergarten students either showed growth or met the goal of recognizing all 56 sight words by June 2017.

#### 1<sup>st</sup> grade WIG:

Goal: By June of 2015 100% of the first graders will meet or exceed the First Grade Fontas and Pinnell reading levels for  $1^{st}$  grade readers.

Results: 87% of our 1<sup>st</sup> graders achieved this goal with the remaining 13% making significant progress towards attaining the Fontas and Pinnell reading level for 1<sup>st</sup> grade.

### 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> grade WIG:

Goal: 80% of the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students will move up at least one RIT stanine on the NWEA in Spring 2017.

Results: 82 % of our 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> graders advanced at least 1 RIT stanine in the vocabulary subtest on the Spring 2017 NWEA Reading test.

#### 2/3 WIG:

Goal: 80% or more of the 3rd grade magnet students will score a 4 or better on the Spring 2017 GPWA.

Results: 100% of the 3rd grade students will score a 4 or better on the spring 2017 GPWA. This was teacher scored.

#### 4th grade WIG:

Goal: 100% of our students will score 95 or higher on the multiplication fact mastery test by June 2017.

Results: 70% of the 4<sup>th</sup> grade students scored 95 or higher on the multiplication fact mastery test by June 2017.

### 5<sup>th</sup> grade WIG:

Goal: 80% of all 5<sup>th</sup> grade students will score a 4 or higher on the GPWA given in the Spring 2017. Results: 70% of the fifth grade students scored a 4 or higher on the Spring 2017 GPWA.

# Pesticide Free on School Grounds Pilot – Learn How You Can Help Defer Elementary

GPPSS has a strong integrated pest management (IPM) program, which focuses on pest prevention and the reduction of pesticide use. Defer has been selected to be a part of a pilot program to make our school grounds pesticide free. This pilot will run from May 2017 through April 2018.

Presently, to control weeds and unwanted grass at Defer these procedures are followed: Raised mowing height, which promotes grass growth and prevents weeds

- Reseeding
- Fertilization
- Roundup pesticide applications twice a year (when school is not in session during Memorial Day and Labor Day weekends)

#### During the pilot we will be replacing the pesticide applications with the following:

- Hand weeding in the garden beds, tree beds, and fence line
- Cutting trees back on the fence line to promote natural ground cover
- Spreading mulch in the weeded areas

#### **How Do We Accomplish This**

Our chairperson of the Beautification Committee is Diana Degen. Diana is a new parent to Defer next year (2017 – 18) with an incoming Young 5's Kindergarten student, but already she has jumped into action for our school. Here's the plan

- Seek out parents, girl scout and boy scout troops, Master Gardeners of Western Wayne County, Garden Club members, and others as volunteers
- To kick off the pilot, two work sessions are scheduled (9:00 a.m. 12:00 p.m.) on June 3<sup>rd</sup> and June 17<sup>th</sup> We expect to weed on June 3<sup>rd</sup> and spread mulch on June 17<sup>th</sup>
- Seek out mulch donations from local businesses.

We need your help to make Defer a *Pesticide Free Zone*. There are plenty of ways you be a part of making this pilot a success!

- Give even an hour of your time on either June 3<sup>rd</sup> or June 17<sup>th</sup>
- Participate in a future work day or coordinate a future work day with your community group
- Sponsor native plants, garden materials, or snacks for the work days

Something to think about: Barnes school in GPW has been pesticide free for several years. Is that what we want for our Defer Dragons too? Please be a part of making Defer an even better place for students and families!

The pilot will focus on the front and side lawns as well as the playground, but will not include baseball/soccer fields at this time.

### **Fighting Brain Drain**

Ahh! Summer! A time to relax and enjoy those lazy days filled with trips to the park, family vacations and backyard barbecues, right? Not so fast! Summer can entail more than just a change from the usual routines. For children, it can mean a serious loss of learning. Research shows that many children experience a 'summer slump' or 'brain drain' and can lose about four to six weeks of growth from the previous school year, often more.

How do I know if my child suffers from 'brain drain'? Review your child's NWEA record that will be coming home with the final Progress Report. If there is a drop between the Spring score and the following Fall score your child may have fallen victim to *brain drain*.

Here are a few ideas recommended by experts to help prevent the dreaded 'brain drain'.

**Read between the lines.** Have your child join the local library's summer reading program or start their own reading program or book club. They can set a goal for reading so many books and even keep track on a book 'growth' chart. Incorporate reading into everyday activities by pointing out bill-boards, fliers, food containers and such. Younger children can play the alphabet game on longer drives.

**Talk the talk.** Ask questions about anything and everything, but not the kind of questions that only illicit "yes" or "no" answers. For instance, ask "What did you like about ...?" Get children talking and you may be able to turn a normal experience into a teaching moment.

**Got game?** Organize game nights not just for your family, but in the neighborhood. Play educational games like Scrabble, Uno, crossword puzzles, Sudoku, or basic card games. They make for a fun night and reinforce skills such as memory, concentration, logic and reasoning. They also teach children how to take turns and be both a good winner and a good loser.

**Vacation your body, not your mind.** Going on a trip can be a great time to expand more than your physical horizons. Use the library and internet to learn about the destination and its historical sites. Study maps and plot mileage. It all adds up to fun. According to the National Summer Learning Association, losing math skills is the biggest threat. Try a number of activities to reinforce math skills. For instance, look at the measurements in a recipe you're making and ask your child to double it. Ask your child to computer the 15% tip on the restaurant bill, or determine how many gallons of gas are needed to travel the 50 miles to grandma's house. Make math a part of your everyday life.

Let's stamp out summer slump when it comes to our Defer Dragons!!


