Tardiness Hinders Student and School Success

Having trouble making it to school on time every day? Then it's time to come up with a new plan. Tardiness is sometimes a chronic problem for some students at Defer and this creates problems for all students and teachers as well.

Did you know that some of the most important learning of the school day occurs between 8:20 and 10:00 am? Students are the most alert and attentive at this time of day, so important subject matter and concepts are taught at this time. When students arrive late to school, they miss out on some or all of these important subjects. They also create a distraction when they walk into the classroom after other students have already begun working. Teachers must stop what they are doing and refocus the group.

Studies show that students, who have perfect or near-perfect attendance, and are not tardy have much better grades and overall success in school than students who miss many days and are tardy.

An occasional tardy is not really a big problem and sometimes cannot be avoided. However, consistent tardiness creates not only the problems discussed above, but also does not help to prepare students for future success in middle and high school, or for the job market.

What can be done about this? Defer will continue to enforce our plan for chronically tardy students. Here's how our tardy policy works:

When a student has three tardies in quick succession (within a two week period), a letter will be sent home notifying the parents that their student has been tardy three times. This will let the parents know that they need to work together with their student to get to school on time each day. The student will miss their class recess on the day the 3rd tardy

If the student continues to struggle with tardiness, the principal will make a phone call home to parents about how tardiness is impacting the student, discuss ways to be on time, and the student will again miss recess to make up for missed instruction.

If tardiness continues to be an issue, the principal and teacher will have a conference with the parents to discuss the problem.

Remember that being on time means being in line and ready to walk into the classroom with the bell rings. Students who are at school but not in their classrooms after the tardy bell are marked tardy.

Defer is a great school with bright students and involved parents. By refocusing our efforts on being on time each day we can be even better!

Tips for Getting to School on Time

If your student is having trouble making it to school on time, try using some or all of the these tips so that you're out the door at school before the bell rings.

- Plan for the 'little things' that always come up. People who are always on time are really people who arrive early every day. That way, when something unexpected comes up, they may not be early, but they will be on time.
- **Understand the importance of being on time.** Students who are always on time earn the best grades, and enjoy the most success. The same is true in the workplace. Start training your student to be on time now, and develop this good habit that will last a lifetime.
- **Get enough sleep.** If getting out of bed in the morning is a problem, make a serious effort to get to bed earlier. Getting enough sleep also helps students focus better in the classroom, and is important for overall good health.
- **Prepare for school the night before**. Don't wait until you are already rushed in the morning to pack up that backpack, or sign homework papers. Get it done the night before and put the backpack by the door.
- What time do you expect to be at school? If the bell rings at 8:20, you should plan to arrive at 8:10 and be in your line by 8:15.
- If one person in the house is running late, everyone is running late. Make a family commitment to be on time to school every day.

For the last three weeks families have poured over Ivan's tale and fell in love with a cast of animal characters. Students answered daily trivia questions, reread important passages, and discussed what might happen next.

Our book has ended and from Kindergarten through 5th grade students wrapped up their discussions with the question – What is the message of the book The One and Only Ivan? Here's what the Defer students had to say:

Mrs. Forcillo's Kindergarten Class – Ivan is about being friends.

Mrs. Richards's Kindergarten Class – Ivan is about friendship with all different kinds of friends, and about keeping our promises.

Ms. Caroselli's 1st grade Class – We learned that Ivan was a good friend. He was always doing kind things for his friends.

Mrs. High's 1st grade Class – Even when you don't look like someone you can still be a friend. Animals should have nice homes. You are not alone – you can make friends anywhere!

Mrs. Gerlach's 2nd grade Class – It teaches us about kindness, friendship, and keeping promises.

Mrs. Lapensee's 2nd grade Class – The book teaches us about friends, family, and freedom.

Mrs. Denison's 3rd grade Class – The theme of the story is FRIENDSHIP! Friends can be different from one and another.

If a costume has a mask student will be asked to not wear it while they are in the parade or the building. This is a safety concern. We don't want students to have difficulty navigating the parade route, or their way through the halls when wearing a mask.

No fake blood. Again, older students may not have a problem with this, but we want to be sure that everyone is the Defer community has the opportunity to enjoy all aspects of our Halloween celebrations.

If students come to school with any of the above, we will ask them to remove the item. If there were any question as to whether or not the costume is appropriate for school, my suggestion would be not to wear it. Thank you in advance for your help and cooperation in this matter. We are all looking forward to another Halloween at Defer, and can't wait to see all of you along the parade route!




Your Clipping matters! Many thanks to the families who clipped, clipped their way to hard cash for Defer PTO programs that benefit our students.






