

What is your mindset? Mindsets are beliefs-beliefs about yourself and your most basic qualities. Think about your intelligence, your talents, and your personality. Are these qualities simply fixed traits, carved in stone or are they things that you can cultivate throughout your life?

People with fixed mindset believe that their traits are just givens. They have a certain amount of brains and talent and nothing can change that. People with a growth mindset, on the other hand, see their qualities as things that can be developed through their dedication and effort. They understand that no one has ever accomplished great things—not Mozart, Darwin, or Michael Jordan- without years of passionate practice and learning.

Compare how people with these two mindsets approach learning-

	Fixed Mindset	Growth Mindset
Challenges	Avoids challenges/Sticks to what they know	Embraces challenges/knows they will come out stronger
Obstacles	Gives up easily	Persists in the face of setbacks
Effort	Sees effort as an unpleasant thing	Sees effort as the path to mastery
Criticism	Sees criticism as negative feed- back	Sees criticism as a source of information and possible improvement
Success of others	Feels threatened by the success of others	Finds lessons and inspiration in the suc- cess of others.

How do teachers support a classroom culture that supports a growth mindset? Lots of ways—but here are two:

- Emphasize Challenge, Not "Success" Learning tasks need to challenge every student in some way and Include some problems or exercises that require students to stretch.
- "Not Yet" The word "yet is valuable in the classroom. Whenever students say they can't do something or are not good at something, the teacher will add, "yet". The message is delivered. You may not have mastered it "yet", but with effort you will.

What can parents do to promote a Growth Mindset in your child? Lots of ways—but here are two:

- Praise the Effort and the Process they engage in—It took Edison over a thousand tries to find the right material to use for the filament of the light bulb.
- Approach Problems as a Mystery—Try different strategies, pick up the clues as you go that will help you solve the problem.

A growth mindset leads to long-term success in school and life.

PBIS Responsibility Pyramid

In last month's newsletter I shared the procedures our staff is adding to the PBIS program. We have created a *Responsibility Pyramid* with expectations for each grade. During the month of January teachers taught these expectations at every grade level focusing on what *responsibility* should look like for them.

Beginning this month we will be adding *purple* cards to our class PBIS chart to reflect specifically on the grade-level expectations from the *Responsibility Pyramid*. A student will receive a purple card for not showing responsible behaviors. Listed below are the procedures around purple cards:

The maximum purple cards a student can earn in a day is one.

- A student in grades 1st 5th will miss the monthly Reward Party if they receive 8 or more purple cards.
- Students will miss the monthly Reward Party is they receive 11 or more purple cards.

Online registration will be mandatory again this August. Please make sure all info phone numbers and emergency contacts are updated in MiStar.




HANDPRINT BANNERS
