

Tardiness Hinders Student and School Success

Having trouble making it to school on time every day? Then it's time to come up with a new plan. Tardiness is sometimes a chronic problem for some students at Defer, and this creates problems for all students and teachers as well.

Did you know that some of the most important learning of the school day occurs between 8:20 and 10:00 am? Students are the most alert and attentive at this time of day, so important subject matter and concepts are taught at this time. When students arrive late to school, they miss out on some or all of these important subjects. They also create a distraction when they walk into the classroom after other students have already begun working. Teachers must stop what they are doing, and refocus the group.

Studies show that students who have perfect, or near-perfect attendance and are not tardy have much better grades and overall success in school than students who miss many days and are tardy

An occasional tardy is not really a big problem, and sometimes cannot be avoided. However, consistent tardiness creates not only the problems discussed above, but also does not help to prepare students for future success in middle and high school, or for the job market.

What can be done about this? Defer has a tardy policy in place. Here's how it works:

• When a student has three times of being tardy in quick succession (with a two week period), a letter will be sent home notifying the parents that their student has been tardy three times. This will let the parents know that they need to work together with their student to get to school on time each day. The students will miss their class recess on the day the 3rd tardy occurs.

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- If the student continues to struggle with tardiness, the principal will make a phone call home to talk to the parents about how tardiness is impacting the student, and to discuss ways to be on time. The student will again miss recess to help make up for missed instruction.
- If tardiness continues to be an issue, the principal and teacher will have a conference with the parents to discuss the problem.

Remember that being on time means being in line and ready to walk into the classroom when the bell rings. Students who are at school, but not in their classrooms after the tardy bell, are marked tardy.

Defer is a great school with bright students and involved parents. By refocusing our efforts on being on time each day, we can be even better!

Tips for Getting to School on Time

If your student is having trouble making it to school on time, try using some or all of the these tips so that you're out the door at school before the bell rings.

- Plan for the 'little things' that always come up. People who are always on time are really people who arrive early every day. That way, when something unexpected comes up, they may not be early, but they will be on time.
- Understand the importance of being on time. Students who are always on time earn the best grades, and enjoy the most success. The same is true in the workplace. Start training your student to be on time now, and develop this good habit that will last a lifetime.
- Get enough sleep. If getting out of bed in the morning is a problem, make a serious effort to get to bed earlier. Getting enough sleep also helps students focus better in the classroom, and is important for overall good health.
- Prepare for school the night before. Don't wait until you are already rushed in the morning to pack up that backpack, or sign homework papers. Get it done the night before and put the backpack by the door.
- What time do you expect to be at school? If the bell rings at 8:20, you should plan to arrive at 8:10 and be in your line by 8:15.
- If one person in the house is running late, everyone is running late.

 Make a family commitment to be on time to school every day.

THIRD GRADE REV UP FOR READING



HALLOWEEN ACTIVITIES

As you begin to prepare your child's costume this year, please do so with the following guidelines in mind:

- No toy guns, knives or swords. Bringing these to school would be a violation of the Grosse Pointe Schools Code of Conduct.
- No scary costumes. Although scary costumes may not bother the older students at Defer, they can create anxiety and fear in many of the younger children. If a costume has a mask, students will be asked to not wear it while they are in the parade or building. Another concern is safety, we do not want students to have any difficulty navigating the parade route, or their way through the halls when wearing a mask.
- No fake blood. Again, older students may not have a problem with this, but we want to make sure that everyone in the Defer community has the opportunity to enjoy all aspects of our Halloween celebrations.
- If students come to school with any of the above, we will ask them to remove the item. If there were any questions as to whether or not the costume is appropriate for school, my suggestion would be not to wear it. Thank you in advance for your help and cooperation in this matter. - Always go haunting with an adult.
- Walk, slither, and sneak on sidewalks, NEVER on the street.
- Be sure to look both ways before crossing the street to check for cars.
- Always cross the street at the corner.
- Wear light-colored or reflective type costumes so you can be seen.
- Light your path with a flashlight.
- Only trick or treat at homes with a porch light on.
- Never go inside a strangers home, accept all treats at the door.
- Be cautious of animals, strangers, and flying saucers.
- All treats should be inspected by a grown-up before eating and sharing.



November Millage Requests are 25% of our Budget

On Tuesday, November 4, our community will decide whether to continue two millages. GPPSS staff members have been going to each building making informational presentations and answering questions at each of the Back to School Night, PTO and Booster meetings. These are key points:

- These two millages make up 25% of our district's budget (~\$25 million).
- These are continuations of existing millage tax levies, although the ballot language must say "increase" as the State sets the rate back to zero (0) when they expire.
- All of the funds raised remain within the Grosse Pointe schools for our students.
- The first proposal (homestead and non-homestead) funds program costs, technology tools, textbooks and other instructional materials.
- The second proposal is a 1 mill sinking fund to maintain our school buildings and update allowable technology. Sinking fund dollars cannot be used for salaries or other human resource expenses, but keep a majority of building repair and improvement projects out of the general fund.
- Both millage proposals are for a period of five years (2015-2019).

Presentations on our current balanced budget, these ballot proposals, monthly financial statements, Michigan school funding and the budget process have been made at televised Board of Education meetings (Comcast channel 20, AT&T 99 and online). Additional information, a list of Frequently Asked Questions, and the ballot language can be found on our district website www.gpschools.org under *Millage 2014*.

We encourage your questions on any topic related to our public schools, as the quality of education we provide directly impacts home values, the quality of life within our community, and the future of our children.

Please educate yourself on this important topic and vote November 4.

Students can bring their loose change each day of the week and drop it off in their classroom. They will also get incentives for walking.


Walking routes are along Kercheval from Whittier to Wayburn and down Nottingham and Balfour up to the school.
