Analysis of districts with higher average teacher salary than GPPSS (using state's 2015 data):

- GPPSS' average teacher salary is \$74,824, ranking 13<sup>th</sup> highest among the state's 830 public and charter school systems (top 1.5% of all, top 2.3% of traditional public schools).
- GPPSS revenue per pupil ranks 82<sup>nd</sup> in state, so just inside top 10% in state.
- The statewide average teacher salary is \$61,978. The GPPSS is \$12,846 (17%) higher than the state average.

Here are the districts with a teacher salary average higher than the GPPSS:
