
Elementary School Ethnicity 2011 - 2012



Special Education ES 2011 – 2012






Middle School Ethnicity 2011 - 2012






















Student Achievement Data Disaggregated by Proficiency Level





ES Math MEAP Grades 3-5 District




ES Reading MEAP Grades 3-5 District






HS Cumulative Grade-Point by Ethnicity




HS Cumulative Grade-Point by FRL




HS Cumulative Grade-Point by Special Education







Caucasian High School Students






African American HS Students by Building
