#### VI. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

#### A. School Board Recognition

The State of Michigan has dedicated January, 2015 as Board of Education Recognition Month. Dr. Harwood thanked the Board for their service to the school system. He acknowledged and commended them for their commitment to ensuring academic success for all students; quality education for all children; and contribution of countless hours of service on behalf of district students.

#### B. Legislative News

Dr. Harwood shared legislative updates from Lansing. He noted the upcoming May 5 election that could possibly increase the sales tax if passed and give billions of dollars for roads and mean an additional \$300 million in the School Aid budget proposal (this would increase the funding by \$200 per pupil). The 3<sup>rd</sup> grade reading retention may be reintroduced as well as the movement of the Teacher and & Administrator Evaluation bills.

#### C. Good News Items

Superintendent Harwood usually uses this opportunity to share good news about students and staff to the community and across the district. He will, however, defer his comments and the time he uses for this portion of the meeting to the students and staff who wish to speak during public comments as they will present their own "good news" about their school, North High School.

### E. Approval of General Appropriations Amendment Act #1 (G.A.A.A. #1)

Mr. Fenton provided information on the G.A.A.A. #1 which matches the current BMU. He noted a decrease in Homestead and Non-Homestead taxes due to declining enrollment of \$128,455; and increase in local revenue of \$304,415; and increase in Unfunded Actuarial Accrued Liability of \$764,123 and a decrease in State Aid due to declining enrollment and Categorical of \$1,877,906 - \$1,113,783; and increase in Federal Grants of \$130,641; and a decrease in Act 18 and Medicaid of \$264,704, for a total increase in revenue of \$806,020. Total increase in expenditures equal \$1,409,314 due to the increase in UAAL (offset by decrease in health care costs) and Title 1 and Preschool Grant adjustments. The projected ending fund equity as of June 30, 2015 is \$7,387,415.

# XI. PUBLIC COMMENTS ON NON-ACTION ITEMS

The following current students and former North student shared their support of North High School and their disappointment in the recent erroneous and negative reporting by Fox 2 News regarding a recent incident at North: Halev Reid

Shari Kam, Grosse Pointe Woods, addressed the Board regarding the Fox 2 News story and the handling of that report which she felt was not based on fact.

Joseph Heard, Grosse Pointe Woods, shared his experience with his son who is a senior and mentor in the Freshman Assist program and the fallacies presented by the Fox 2 News story.

Kara Harvin, Grosse Pointe Woods, spoke regarding letters of recommendation she requested for her children for Liggett.

Dino Ricci, Grosse Pointe Farms, expressed his concerns over the lack of residency enforcement by the Board and administration.

Sheryl Hogan, President of the Secretaries group, welcomed new Board members. She spoke about the professional development opportunities for secretaries and commended Mrs. Bur and Gary Abud for their help in facilitating these offerings.

Laura Mikesell, GPEA President, thanked Mr. Summerfield for his budget work in the district. She also addressed the Fox 2 News story that presented false information about a recent incident at North High School. She said it is great to be a Norseman.

Chris Kasinowski, Grosse Pointe Shores, applauded the Board for approving Organic Chemistry. She also addressed Board decorum and asked Board members to improve communication with one another.

Allison Baker, Grosse Pointe Park, and current Vice-President of the Family Center, thanked Mrs. Gafa for forwarding her compensation to the Family Center. She congratulated the new Board members and commended the students, parents and staff at North High School.

# XII. OTHER COMMENTS FROM BOARD AND SUPERINTENDENT

Trustee Ismail congratulated the new Board officers. He noted that Mrs. Bur had done an incredible job on the Professional Development workshops. He thanked the students who spoke this evening. He asked Dr. Harwood about the speaker that requested teacher recommendations for her child to attend Liggett.

Trustee Pangborn concurred with Mr. Ismail about the spirit at North and said she is a cheerleader for both high schools. She noted that it was great to hear and see the students speak. She asked students not to be angry at the reporter, but rather, to take away what they have learned from this experience.

Trustee Weertz thanked the students and adults who came to speak this evening. She said she is very proud of North, its students, staff and administrators.

Trustee Summerfield thanked all who spoke this evening also, especially the North students who shared how they felt about their school. He told those students that the whole community supports them and everything they are doing at North is fabulous. He encouraged the students to look at this as an educational opportunity to learn. North is a great school.

Trustee Valente appreciated Organic Chemistry coming forth as a course this evening. She hopes that Calculus 3 comes next as a new course. Mrs. Valente added that she feels it was personally insulting to her as a Board member to hear about the Fox 2 News story regarding an incident at North. She was also offended by the two employees who spoke to Fox 2 News about the incident. We trust our administrators to work through these situations. We are one district – one community.

Trustee Roeske thanked all of the speakers this evening especially the students who had an opportunity to participate in politics this evening and share their thoughts. He knows what goes on at North and commended the North community as they worked through this incident. He wished Mr. Hamka a Happy Birthday.

Superintendent Harwood wished Mr. Hamka a Happy Birthday! He thanked the Board for the work that they do noting that this was School Board Recognition Month. He additionally thanked Mrs. Bur for her work throughout the district making sure the staff get what they need with professional development offerings. He addressed Norseman pride and mentioned Mrs. Murray's first graduation speech and how moving it was. In it she pointed out the successes at North High School and the student successes that North students experience. Dr. Harwood noted that this is what we do here – protect each other and each student's successes as we work together. He is proud of the staff, students and administration at North commenting how that was reflected in the comments made this evening. He is thankful to be part of that.

President Gafa thanked fellow Board members for putting their trust in electing her to lead the Board this year. She made note of a challenge that the Monteith community is participating in. It is called *The Great Kindness Challenge* and asked the community to be part of that challenge. She thanked Mrs. Murray for everything she does at North adding that there are awesome kids doing awesome things at North. An entire student body was hurt by adults who made comments about North but the North community stuck together and worked through the challenges presented. Mrs. Gafa read a summary of recent events that occurred at North and the administrative investigation that took place to address the incident reported by Fox 2 News concluding that the correct steps were taken and dealt with by administration. In summation, Mrs. Gafa said that the district has two outstanding high school leaders and two outstanding high schools.
