# Introduction

Richard Elementary School served 415 students from Kindergarten through fifth grade during the 2007-08 school year. The staff included eighteen classroom teachers and teachers of Art, Vocal and Instrumental Music, Physical Education, Spanish and Library/Media. Other professionals included a Language Arts/Reading Specialist, Resource Center Specialist, Psychologist, Social Worker, Speech Pathologist, and an Autism Spectrum Disorder teacher.

Our beautiful school building has been declared by the State of Michigan to be a historical site. It displays lovely architectural elements and has been maintained and updated over the years. In addition to a full computer lab, students at every grade level utilize wireless laptops throughout the entire school building.

Teachers used a variety of instructional strategies according to students' abilities, learning styles, and interests. The strategies included instructional pacing, acceleration, flexible grouping, in-depth studies, cooperative learning, and high-interest activities. Several teachers piloted new mathematics and social studies textbooks and materials.

Many enrichment opportunities were provided for students by teachers and Richard parent volunteers. These activities included Chess Club, Fourth and Fifth Grade Choir, Student Council, Service Club, Safety Patrol, pottery, Lego-building, scrapbooking, games and puzzles, knitting, and many other activities scheduled outside the regular school day. Our Team REACH (Richard Actively Contributing to Humanity) consisting of our community of children, led by a group of parent volunteers, continued making positive changes locally, nationally, and globally by doing good works for others. Students authored original books and sent them to Africa through the Books of Hope Foundation.

Our Richard PTO provided generous support for our students including assemblies, classroom materials, enrichment activities, and library books. Richard School parents are very committed to their children's education and show it on a daily basis through volunteering in classrooms, the lunchroom, and the playground and by participating in enrichment activities, field trips, career

awareness, and assemblies.

The PTO's 2008 Richard Movie Mania Carnival held in April, was well attended by many community members and met its goal as a "friend-raiser" project.

## **Core Curriculum**

The Grosse Pointe Public School System's core curriculum is developed under the auspices of the Educational Programs Leadership Council (EPLC), a group of teachers, parents, students, and administrators who meet monthly.

The core curriculum is based upon state standards in all subjects and extends beyond those standards by incorporating exemplary national standards. Curriculum committees, comprised of teachers, parents, students and administrators develop plans for each curriculum area. In addition, the views of the broader community are sought through Public Forums. The reports of the curriculum committees, which are submitted first to the EPLC and then to the Board of Education, include recommendations regarding assessment, staff development, integration of technology, and differentiated instruction to accommodate academic diversity as well as the curriculum itself. The district also offers a wide array of advanced placement and challenging enrichment courses and a comprehensive special education program.

During 2007–08 the district implemented a new Mathematics curriculum and piloted a variety of math materials culminating in the selection of *Everyday Math* for grades 1-5 and Harcourt for Kindergarten. A new social studies curriculum was adopted for grades K-2 and 5 (grades 3 and 4 are still under study due to late changes in the state curriculum) and materials to support instruction were purchased.

During 2008-09 the science curriculum will be under review. Kindergarten and first grade teachers and reading specialists also received significant training and support materials to implement FAST reading strategies in 2008-09. Additional model units and technology applications are continually being integrated into curricular areas.

The district's strong curriculum is demonstrated by the continuing high performance of our students on standardized assessments including NWEA, MEAP, ACT, SAT, and Advanced Placement tests.
