

COMMUNITY MILESTONES

The board is asking voters to consider a \$120 million bond proposal to improve facilities across the district, with \$60 million allocated for district critical needs and \$60 million from community input.

The bond would be offered at a **zero taxrate increase** (from the existing millage rate) for community members, continuing the district's mission to **"build the future"** for our community's children.

The sinking fund, approved by voters in November 2024, will restore and improve safety and security, as well as upgrade instructional technology across the district. This 2025 bond initiative will focus heavily on infrastructure improvements across the district.

ZERO TAX-RATE INCREASE

FROM EXISTING MILLAGE RATE

If passed, the current millage rate is estimated to remain at or below 3.14 mills which is an estimated zero tax-rate increase from the debt millage levied in 2024.
