## 4 Pillars of Successful Bonds 6:10-6:15

A bond is not just a budget—it's a **message.** Successful bond proposals meet four key criteria:

- 1. Clarity: The public knows exactly what's in it. There's no confusion.
- 2. Balance: Every part of the community sees something meaningful for their local schools.
- 3. Value: The community sees that their tax dollars are being used wisely to directly improve the educational experience for students—whether through enhanced learning environments, long-term cost savings, or visible, meaningful upgrades to buildings and infrastructure.
- 4. Inspiration: Something bold, visible, and energizing that says, "this is what our future looks like."



## Homework Items and Option from column "E"-6:15-6:45

- <u>HERE</u> 1 (Dr. Tuttle) is a document with updated and accurate figures for all identified priorities. Column E reflects the district's recommended allocations, based on a comprehensive review of both quantitative and qualitative data gathered during the BAC meeting. After value engineering, the total recommended investment amounts to **\$54,750,000** (total of column E). This proposal includes reductions in scope for furniture, LED lighting, and boiler systems. We will discuss these proposed reductions in greater detail at the next meeting, during which we will outline the rationale behind each recommendation.
- **HERE** 2 (Mr. Kent) is a document outlining specific locations where furniture replacements are truly needed. This will NOT be included in community information.
- HERE 3 (Mr. Kent) are updated building maps that reflect the revised LED lighting scope, which has been narrowed from covering all areas to focusing solely on common spaces, excluding classrooms. This will NOT be included in community information.
- HERE 4 (Mr. Kent) are the additions (IA, Elworthy, Parcells space, athletic practice fields)
- <u>HERE 5</u> (review) is a document that shows the use of the district captured **\$60M** and how it is being allocated for each building's critical needs with ~\$6M for Trombly.
- HERE 6 (review) is a document with the Q and A from the last meeting.

• Be Hard on the Ideas, Soft on the People

It's okay to challenge concepts—but not each other. Focus on priorities, not personalities.

• One Voice at a Time

Listen fully without interrupting. We learn the most when we're not the ones talking.

• Stay Solution-Oriented

Voice concerns with the goal of improvement. Help us move the conversation forward, not backwards.
