Input/ Taking In Information "Knowing"	<p>Listening Skills "Tuning In" *Parent/Adult "tunes in," models interest/enjoyment in listening to the child, etc. *Parent/Adult encourages/elicits child's listening behaviors and skills for the following listening skills: *Listening to the sounds in the environment *Listening to the sounds in our language</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Phonological Awareness: recognizing rhyming patterns in words, awareness of syllables, words, and sentences • Phonemic Awareness: ability to hear/detect/manipulate individual sounds 	<p>Reading Skills *Parent/Adult models/displays interest/enjoyment in the reading process: reading for pleasure, reading for information *Parent/Adult encourages child's interest in/participation with:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Books • Letters • Symbols • Alphabet • Numbers • Print 	<p>Viewing Skills *Parent/Adult models/displays interest/enjoyment in the viewing process: making observations, watching educational shows, performances *Parent/Adult encourages child's participation in the viewing process of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Making observations of the physical world • Watching a scene from or an entire children's movie/play, sports/theater performance, etc.
Output/ Expressing Information "Showing"	<p>Speaking Skills "Talking More and Taking Turns" *Parent/Adult models interest in conversation and use of eye contact/body language *Parent/Adult encourages/elicits:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vocabulary usage • Using sentences • Retelling events/stories • Conversation draws on all aspects of language; using language socially with others as well as linguistic skills. 	<p>Writing Skills *Parent/Adult models/displays interest/enjoyment/need to write down messages. *Parent/Adult encourages/elicits the child's:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Interest in fine motor activities: cutting, manipulating objects, using chalk, play doh • Copying letters/words • Sounding out letters/words • Writing sentences to express ideas, imagination, etc. 	<p>Visually Representing Skills Parent/Adult modeling, then elicits child's participation with:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scribbling progressing to drawing • Use of 3-D materials to represent--building with blocks, molding with clay, play doh, pretend play • Use of technology to create, use of drawing pad apps, etc.
