The Importance of Homework

What does the term 'homework' mean to you? In your family, does 'homework' have a positive or a negative connotation? For some, the word 'homework' is associated with the idea that such work is drudgery, a necessary evil of attending school. For others, homework is viewed as a precious opportunity to boost learning, and they're right!!!!

There are three purposes for the assigning of homework. They are listed below along with an example of this type of homework being assigned at Defer.

To give students opportunities to practice skills. To execute a skill, students must reach a level of self-sufficiency. When practicing, they are to improve their accuracy and speed. At Defer math fact practice, spelling practice, and EDM homework all fall into this category.

To prepare students for a new topic. To do this students have to retrieve their prior knowledge. This homework might ask a child to reflect on what they have learned from other classes, or from their reading. For example, if the students were going to read Jack London's "To Build A Fire", the homework might be to write experiences they have had in bitter cold.

To elaborate on introduced material. This type of homework asks the student to extend their knowledge. For example, our 5th graders studied controls and variables in Science and then set up an experiment to test their own hypothesis using controls and one variable.

Fast Facts and Tips for Homework

In order for students to reach competency, **they must practice it 24 times**. When your child does not do their homework they have missed out on a practice session towards mastery.

Students should keep track of their assignments by using an agenda or homework notebook. *Our students complete their agendas every day at Defer.*

If students are practicing a skill like times tables they would benefit from keeping track of their speed and accuracy. Students track this information in their data binders at school.

All students should read for at least 20 minutes a night. This is in addition to their assigned homework.

Parents should help with homework by establishing a routine and finding a place. The amount of homework should be enough to equal grade level times 10. In other words, 3rd graders should have 30 minutes of homework on school nights, and 4th graders should have 40 minutes. This does not include reading for 20 minutes nightly.

Bottom Line

Homework is essential to student learning!

February's Specials

Each day all of the Defer students attend a Specials class.

They include: Art, Library/Spanish (3rd-5th), Music, and Physical Education Below is a birds-eye view into one aspect of each grade's upcoming work this month and a great conversation starter with your child--no matter what grade(s).

ART

Kindergarten Kindergarten artists finish their unit on circles and spheres with Kandinsky circle paintings and designer turtle drawings. Students will also make a textured circle pendant from clay using their shoe as a stamp.

- 1st grade artists will learn about Asian culture, animals and art. Students will create panda collages with cherry blossoms based on the book "Zen Shorts" by Jon J Muth and koinobori (carp kites to celebrate Children's Day).
- 2nd grade artists continue learning about symmetry with colorful snowflake paper cuts. They will finish their batik (fabric resist) animals and monsters which will be made into pillows!
- 3rd 3rd grade artists finish their tabby weavings using yarn.
- 4th grade artists finish sewing their Ugly Doll felt monster soft sculptures.
- 5th grade artists finish their double sided weavings and start a precept printmaking project.



MUSIC

Kindergarten Kindergarten continues to work on finding the steady beat in any kind of music through the use of movement, scarves, bean bags, etc.

1st 1st graders are identifying the instruments in the story of "Peter and the Wolf".

2nd 2nd graders will be tested on their sight reading of music through the use of solfedge---sol & mi.

3rd 3rd graders have begun to discuss and play the Percussion Family of instruments.

4th 4th graders continue their instruction of 5-notes that are played on the recorder.

5th 5th graders will begin a unit on music symbols and their meanings in music.

LIBRARY

- Kindergarten Kindergarteners finished their Penguin Fiction/nonfiction unit documenting facts about penguins and also with dressing a funny (fiction) character penguin from Helen Lester's, Three Cheers for Tacky.
 - 1st 1st graders are wrapping up their Polar Animal Unit by researching facts on Polar Bears, and making a polar bear puppet, with their favorite fact written on the back.
 - 2nd 2nd graders have been studying Story Elements, finishing with a fun Library Game on the subject.
 - 3rd 3rd graders are finishing up their Big 6 Animal Research project.
 - 4th 4th graders are exploring Kids Info Bits database.
 - 5th Fifth graders are using 7 different research sources to find facts on explorer.



PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Kindergarten Students are learning how to Chinese jump rope and how the handle a hockey stick.

- 1st Getting ready for our JRFH event in February. Students are learning all different ways to jump rope including long rope jumping in small groups.
- 2nd Working with partners, students are excited to jump rope with a jump stick and also adding their skills to a bit of hockey in the game "Take the Goalie's Place."
- 3rd Students are learning that exercise is important in the everyday health while testing out their skills in jump roping and hockey fun.
- Working in small groups practicing a variety of jump rope skills. Fourth graders are also working on their hockey team skills participating in Sideline hockey games.
- Jump rope is an excellent way to exercise, not only to stay healthy, but to stay strong in
 Other sports. Fifth graders learn how this skill crosses over to other activities in their life.
 Fifth graders are also participating in sideline hockey which promotes communication and team work skills.


