

Teacher Appreciation Week

This is officially National Teacher Appreciation Week 2015 – May 4th to May 10th. National Teacher Appreciation Day is May 5th. The history of National Education Week and Day is not certain. The movement for such an observance is commonly thought to have begun around the time of World War II and Eleanor Roosevelt made a major push for the day in 1953.

ATTENTION: FAMILIES OF FIFTH AND EIGHTH GRADE STUDENTS

Effective Immediately

The Board of Education feels strongly about enforcing our residency requirements and not opening our district to School of Choice options. Rather than incur the cost of a total district reregistration, the administration is performing a **total re-verification of students entering sixth and ninth grades**. Families who have already verified their address this school year due to an address change are exempt from this process.

This link for Residency Re-Verifications you will find more information about the documents required for this process. You must bring all the required documents with you. We encourage you to come to the Administration Building at 389 St. Clair Avenue, Grosse Pointe by **August 1**. The office hours are: 8:00 am - 4:00 pm Monday through Thursday and 8:00 am - 3:30 pm on Friday. Questions may be directed to Denise Sharples at 313-432-3083, option 2.

Class assignments will not be shared in August if you have not completed this re-verification process.

Please remember, that only one parent/legal guardian must reside within the district for their child to legally attend our schools. Students found to be attending without meeting residency requirements, are removed immediately.

This is one more method to assure our community that the children in our buildings are our students.


