This is a great opportunity for next year's Kindergarten families to visit Defer and for our 5th grade families to visit Pierce or one of the other middle schools.

W.I.G. Wildly Important Goals



During the months of September and October the Defer staff at each grade level reviews the Spring data from the previous school year as well as the Fall data. This study results in establishing the overall goal for the grade and this goal become the focus of our tiered support for students. Below are the 2016 – 2017 goals for our students.

<u>Kindergarten</u>: 85 % of the Kindergarten students will recognize all 56 Kindergarten sight words by June 2017 or show growth toward this goal.

 $\frac{1^{st} \text{ grade}}{1^{st} \text{ grade}}$: 90% of the 1st grade students will meet or exceed the standards for Fountas and Pinnell reading levels which is Level G-H for 1st grade.

<u>2nd and 3rd grade</u>: 80% of the 2nd and 3rd grade students will improve a full strand on the NWEA testing for the Vocabulary subtest.

<u>2nd and 3rd grade Magnet</u>: 80% or more of the 3rd grade students will score a 4 or higher on the Spring 2017 GPWA.

 $\frac{4^{th} \text{ grade}}{4^{th} \text{ grade}}$: 100% of the 4th grade students will score 95 or higher on the multiplication fact mastery test by June 2017.

<u>5th grade</u>: 80% of all 5th grade students will score a 4 or higher as on the Grosse Pointe Writing Assessment in May 2017.

<u>4th and 5th grade Magnet</u>: 85% of the students will accomplish through Course 3 on *Hour of Code* computer science programming.

Defer Reminders



Each month we will be sharing some *friendly* reminders about Defer procedures. Some you may know very well and other might be new to you.

• Parking is not allowed in the school parking lot when dropping students off in the morning or picking up at the end of the day.

The north side of Nottingham street is a drop-off/pick-up lane. Parents using this lane must remain in their car.

- Dogs or other pets are not allowed on the school property.
- We celebrate birthdays at Defer. Each child has their name announced on the PA system, they receive a birthday book from the PTO, a birthday pencil, and a book mark with their picture with Mrs. Sullivan.
- Lost and Found is located in the gym.
- Children arriving late for school should be brought to the office by their parent or guardian and signed in.
- Parents should not hold the school door open for others when they are buzzed into the building.
- Student may not share food items in the lunchroom.
- School newsletters are published the first Thursday of every month. The newsletter includes an update from the PTO each month.

Positive Behavioral Interventions and Support

The PBIS program continues to be a backbone of Defer. It is based on the premise that all students will benefit from well implemented, evidence-based practices for improving student behavior. School-wide PBIS provides a positive focus to encourage desirable student behaviors. A set of universal expectations for behavior, positively stated, are established for all students in all locations of the school. These expectations generally promote core values of **respect**, **responsibility**, and **safety**. Interventions and strategies are implemented to teach and reinforce these expectations. These include:

Periodic direct instruction in specific student behaviors that demonstrate respect, responsibility, and safety in various locations in the school.

 Generous quantities of positive adult/teacher attention and other kinds of reinforcement to students for demonstrating positive behaviors, especially specific behavior expectations identified by the school.
 Predictable consequences for behavior infractions that are delivered consistently by all staff in a professional manner throughout the entire school.

Each month Defer school celebrates the good behavior of our students. The October PBIS party was entitled: *Choose Your Own Adventure*. Teachers each offered a unique activity in their classrooms and students signed -up for the one they were most interested in participating in as their Reward Party. Student choices included watching a movie, playing bingo, building with Legos, bring your own technology device and many more. Whatever the choice – a good time was had by all!

Leadership and the 7 Habits

Each month our Dragon Dens meet to focus on one of the 7 Habits. We see students demonstrate these habits on a daily basis at Defer and we want to recognize the students we are becoming. Across from the school office some of our teacher leaders have created a display recognizing these behaviors in students. The theme of the display is *Defer Spots Leaders* and examples of students using the Habits will be placed on 'spots' along with student pictures to recognize this good work.

In addition, we are adding a new dimension to our leadership work this year at Defer. We have kicked off our *Leadership Necklaces*. Every student will have a leadership necklace and during the year students will have the opportunity to add charms to their necklaces as they demonstrate different types of leadership. Last week any student that completed their Summer Work Packet earned the first charm on the their necklace. We will be recognizing this leadership each month at our Town Hall meetings. Congratulations to this first round of leaders!



Library News

The magnet classes were busy in the library this October. Mrs. Bergeron's students reviewed how to locate fiction and nonfiction in the library. We reasoned which resources are the best for our research. We tackled print encyclopedias (Coming soon: digital version!) and shared ways in which we show manners while using the Internet. Mrs. Mannino's students reviewed how to access the online card catalog to find materials we need (in 17 libraries!). We also reviewed how libraries organize fiction and nonfiction. Students compared online databases and used digital resources to find information.
