Students learn:

Concept 1

Readers choose books that interest them and keep them engaged.

- Readers use the cover of the book to help them decide if it interests them.
- Readers look through the cover and pages of the book it help them decide if it interests them.
- Readers have a special place to keep their books and read them. Readers finish reading one book and start reading another.
- Readers replace the books they have read back in the classroom library when they are done reading them.

Concept 2

Readers think about their stories and make plans with partners to share their thinking.

Concept 3

Readers have thoughts as they read and share their thoughts with others.

- Readers connect books they are reading to their own experiences.
- Readers connect books they are reading to other books they have read.
- Readers connect books they are reading to the world.

- Readers talk about the connections they are making while reading with others.
- Readers connect books they are reading with books others are reading.

Concept 4

Readers have strategies for checking comprehension

- Readers ask themselves questions before reading a book.
- Readers ask themselves questions while reading a book.
- Readers ask themselves questions after reading a book.
- Readers question themselves before, during and after reading.
- Readers help their partners by asking questions.
