



Roll and Record Number Game



Materials needed:

One **die** for each player.

(Dice will be needed for several math games this year.)

One **graphing record sheet** for each player. (Homework paper.)

Pencil, yellow and orange crayons

1. Each player (adult helper may also play) writes his/her name on the top of the game graph paper.
2. When the adult leader calls "roll 'em", each player rolls one die into a bowl.
3. The number shown on the die is traced with correct formation in the matching column on the graph, beginning with the starred number on the bottom row.
4. The game continues for 10 minutes, or until one player reaches the top of the graph for one number.
5. Encourage lots of "math talk": count and compare.
Use words like *more, most, less, least, fewer, fewest, equal*.
6. When time is up, each player identifies the number column with the **MOST** traced numbers, and colors the traced numbers **yellow**. If two (or more) columns are **equal**, they should both be colored yellow.
7. Each player then identifies the column with the **FEWEST** traced numbers, and colors the traced numbers **orange**. If two (or more) columns are **equal**, they should both be colored orange.
