New elementary students: register and prove residency by May 1 to Ensure Your Child(ren) Can Attend Your Neighborhood School

On Monday, March 26, the Board of Education passed Policy 5120 Assignment within District. This allows the district to assign resident students who register and enroll after May 1 to schools within GPPSS other than their neighborhood schools and is projected to save between \$300,000 and \$500,000 annually. The details of this important change are included in Administrative Guideline 5120.

### Key points include:

- If a family establishes residency and completes enrollment by May 1st, its student(s) will be assigned to their neighborhood school (no change from current practice). You can guarantee that your child will attend their neighborhood school by establishing residency and completing the enrollment process by May 1<sup>st</sup>.
- If you enroll your child post May 1<sup>st</sup> and their school is full, they will be assigned to another elementary near your neighborhood school. Parents will be provided choices regarding where their child will attend if their neighborhood school does not have space for their child(ren).

Please read <u>Administrative Guideline 5120</u> for details, or call <u>313-432-3044</u> with questions. The Residency Office will be open over Spring Break 8 a.m.-4 p.m. Monday through Thursday, and 8 a.m.-3:30 p.m. Friday for walk-ins. A list of required documents to <u>verify residency</u> is on the website. Call <u>313-432-3083</u> if you need to schedule an appointment outside these hours.

## Please Update Your Contact Info in the Parent Portal

The district would like to take this opportunity to remind families to update their contact information through <u>MiStar Parent Portal</u>. For the 6,000 who have downloaded the New and improved district app (available free for Apple and Android) thank you. Now **please take the important Step 2** and select GPPSS and your school(s) if you have not done so already! Without that you won't receive important school and district texts straight to your phone. In return, the district will add the App to our emergency notification process and continue to review and update our safety protocol regularly.

This also provides an opportunity for you to **review all appropriate safety precautions with your children** and urge them to use caution and common sense in any situation that feels uncomfortable or dangerous to them. Please be sure that your children know to **report any incident immediately** to an adult. ### **Guiding Children to Solve Their Own Problems**

Love and Logic Step One: Empathy.

"How sad."

"I bet that hurts."

Love and Logic Step Two: Send the "Power Message."

"What do you think you're going to do?"

Love and Logic Step Three: Offer choices.

"Would you like to hear what other kids have tried?"

At this point, offer a variety of choices that range from bad to good. It's usually best to start out with the poor choices.

Each time a choice is offered, go on to step four, forcing the youngster to state the consequence in his/her own words. This means that you will be going back and forth

between Love and Logic steps three and four.

Love and Logic Step Four: Have the child state the consequences.

"And how will that work?"

Love and Logic Step Five: Give permission for the child to either solve the problem

or not solve the problem.

"Good luck. I hope it works out."

Have no fear. If the child is fortunate enough to make a poor choice, he/she may have a double learning lesson.

### Duckie Deck Trash Toys - Ages 3+ iPhone, iPod Touch, iPad - \$2.99

Duckie Deck Trash Toys is a virtual creation tool made for preschoolers. Kids choose from a variety of recycled and found items and make creatures. Kids aren't limited by how many items they can add to their creature. No ads, parent settings, or instructions distract or limit kids. With Earth Day just passing, this app is a great way to show students how to be creative using reusable items. It's a wonderful tie-in for Earth Day and Spring.



codeSpark Academy - Ages 5+ iPhone, iPod Touch, iPad, Android, Chromebook, Kindle, Windows Phone - Free (but upgrade is available for a charge)

https://codespark.com/ codeSpark Academy includes several increasingly challenging drag-and-drop coding puzzles that introduce kids to the logic of programming using visual blocks of code. No instructions are available in-app, but parents can access a full curriculum explaining the concepts on the codeSpark website linked in the parent section. Keep in mind that the app is available by slightly different names for Android and iOS devices.



### Thinkrolls 2 App - iPhone, iPad, Android, Kindle Fire - Ages 5+ - \$2.99

Thinkrolls 2 follows the same smart, fun format as <u>Thinkrolls</u>, adding new science concepts such as density, force, and electricity. Two settings — easy and hard — keep challenges appropriate for preschoolers and up, and parents can create accounts for up to six users, customizing the challenge level for each. The challenges require thinking and planning ahead, but kids can try without penalty until they figure it out. Every completed level leads to a fun new ball character to play with.
