Registration and Enrollment

1. **All new students** must be registered and enrolled in the district. Kindergarten enrollment no longer requires an appointment, enrollment is on a walk-in-basis. Hours for enrollment are Monday through Thursday 8 am to 4 pm and Friday 8 am to 3:30 pm at 389 St. Clair, Grosse Pointe. Question #2- What is your favorite summer activity? We need this information early so the district can budget and staff

appropriately. If you're not certain if your child will be attending the public schools next year, please contact us anyway. District staff can answer questions about placement and programming and provide additional information that may assist you.

Children turning five years of age before September 1, 2017, are eligible for Kindergarten in the 2017-2018 school year. If you know of a new neighbor or family in the Richard district with children, please let them know to register their child for Kindergarten!

5th grade artists are finishing up their monster plush/felt dolls. The 4th graders are busy finishing up their Picasso portraits and some are onto the Advertising project for Grosse Pointe businesses. 3rd graders have all finished their Incan masks and are now onto the Advertising project as well.

Library



Kindergarten began the zookeeper research project with animal-sound bingo (we were so surprised at the sound a rhino makes!) and non-fiction books about zoos. Which animal did your kindergartener choose to be zookeeper for? First graders practiced ABC order this month, especially as a tool for locating picture books on the shelves. Second graders were masterful scavenger hunters as we practiced using call numbers to locate books throughout all five library "neighborhoods." Coming soon: Scranimal Island! Third graders, fresh from their Spanish rotation, recalled and challenged catalog searching skills. Our "Mystery Michigander" research project begins with an exploration of print and online encyclopedias. Fourth graders have been brainstorming this month--familiar authors, biography components, and research resources--laying the groundwork for an author biography research project. Encyclopedia articles offered fifth graders some of the first answers to their "expert" research focus questions. We've practiced note-taking and used the library catalog to identify and interlibrary loan a "just-right" book to further our research. Next time you're in the library, enjoy some of the titles in the mini-library our students created to celebrate National Library Week...but remember to use a (mini) shelf stick!

3rd graders in Mr. Swansey's class learned about the OPAC, our online card catalog and how we can access materials from 17 libraries with a click of a mouse! We also learned about cyber-safety and the important distinction between personal and private information. We will also begin accessing online databases to conduct research.

4th graders in Ms. Schmitz's class learned all the ways students can avoid plagiarism. These 4th graders as well as Mr. Gulian's 5th grade class learned about the dangers of oversharing on social media as part of our cyber-safety lessons. We also reviewed strategies for online research and how to access online databases via the GPPL resource page.

Testing Tips for Students

- * Make sure they get a good night's sleep before a test and eat properly the day of a test. f
- * Maintain a pleasant home environment and avoid unnecessary conflicts. Try to make the morning of the test a pleasant one. Do not add to their stress. f
- * Make sure they have taken any necessary medications. f
- * Question #4- Did you attend GP schools?
- * Ensure that they are present during testing. (Children generally perform better when taking tests in their groups rather than at a make-up time). f
- * Get them to school on time the day of the test. f
- st Wish them luck each morning of the test. Remind them that they are special and that you believe in them. f
- * Remind them that the test is important and encourage them to do their best.

The district would like to take this opportunity to remind families to update their contact information through <u>MiStar Parent Portal</u>. For the 6,000 who have downloaded the New and improved district app (available free for Apple and Android) thank you. Now **please take the important Step 2 and select GPPSS and your school(s)** if you have not done so already! Without that you won't receive important school and district texts straight to your phone. In return, the district will add the App to our emergency notification process and continue to review and update our safety protocol regularly.

This also provides an opportunity for you to **review all appropriate safety precautions with your children** and urge them to use caution and common sense in any situation that feels uncomfortable or dangerous to them. Please be sure that your children know to **report any incident immediately** to an adult. Remind your student that school staff and parent volunteers are present at arrival, dismissal and lunch/recess. Being polite is not as important as being safe. Our most important priority, like yours, is keeping our students safe. We appreciate your continued support in helping us do that.

What is Safety Town?

What are the Dates?


Two-week sessions begin June 19th and run through August 18th (Note: there is no Safety Town the week of July 3rd).
