# Kerby 2013-14 Annual Report

## Introduction

Kerby Elementary School is a vibrant learning community where students are encouraged to do their personal best in a warm and welcoming environment. We have a talented staff dedicated to the development of students as learners. Students are able to clearly demonstrate a strong value system for their own education as well as the ability to show respect and integrity for themselves and others.

Below are a few 'Kerby Pointes of Pride' from the 2013-14 school year.

- 74 fifth grade students participated in the Bair Lake Adventure Challenge Education program
- 110 fourth and fifth grade students provided service to our school community through the safety patrol, service squad, recycling and library clubs
- Through PTO collaboration, student, staff and community efforts, Kerby earned 'Evergreen' status within the Michigan Green school initiative.
- The Kerby Student Council sponsored the Relay for Life, Gleaners Food Bank, Book Drive, Valentine Mail Boxes, Holiday cards for Senior Citizens, Spirit Days, Talent Show, Staff vs. Student Council softball game
- Reaching Out projects supported and collected donations for the Full Circle Garden Work Day, Dollar for Daisies and Operation Gratitude.
- The 3rd grade sponsored a Bake Sale and Garage Sale to support funding for the Peace Garden as well as Kerby grounds.
- The PBIS (Positive Behaviors, Interventions and Supports) program implemented the FISH philosophy building-wide
- The Kerby Peace Garden received the 2013 Beautification Award from the City of Grosse Pointe Farms
- We welcomed author Jonathon Rand to Kerby during March is Reading Month.
- Kerby was awarded two grants funded by the Grosse Pointe Foundation. The 5th grade students received fifteen lap tops as well as three ipads and three Apple TV's. The entire building adopted the FISH philosophy with the funding for building-wide curriculum as well as supplementary materials.

The Kerby PTO is an energized and generous group of people dedicated to the development of children! We are so fortunate to have a supportive group that not only provides many hours of volunteering within our school but also is able to provide family-friendly events and building-wide opportunities in order to provide funds for our school. The PTO offered our families a Scholastic Book Fair, Family Bingo Night, lunchtime enrichment classes such as Spanish class, Fiscal Fridays, Lunches with Love, Arts and Scraps, Kindergarten Crafts, and Stained Glass Class. The PTO ended the year with a Kerby Carnival Night and Tin Can Auction for Technology. With the revenue brought in by these events and all of your generosity, the PTO generously gave funding for two drinking fountains with filling stations, Video Announcement equipment, teacher stipends for supplies, and 54 ipads with carts and cases for the upper and lower wing.

The Kerby community is dedicated toward working together for the best interest of all children.

## **Assignment of Studies**

The Board has determined attendance areas and students shall be expected to attend school within that area. A parent may request a transfer or appeal a placement decision on behalf of their student.

The principal shall be responsible for assigning students to classes. In the elementary schools, the principal, in determining the grade level for any new student, may take into consideration the previous schooling of the student but may assign the student to a lower grade level or higher grade level, if in the principal's judgment such an assignment would be in the best interest of the student. In middle school and high school students will be assigned to counselors, classes and instructors by the building principal.

The district also has in place policies and guidelines which guide promotion and retention.

## **Core Curriculum**

The Grosse Pointe Public School System's core curriculum is developed under the auspices of the Educational Programs Leadership Council (EPLC), a group of teachers, parents, students, and administrators who meet monthly. The core curriculum is based upon state standards in all subjects and extends beyond those by incorporating exemplary local and national standards. Reports of the curriculum committees, which are submitted first to the EPLC then to the Board of Education, include recommendations regarding assessment, professional development, integration of technology, and differentiated instruction to accommodate academic diversity as well as the curriculum itself. The district also offers a wide array of advanced placement and challenging enrichment courses and a comprehensive special education program.

During the 2013-14 school year, EPLC led the curriculum review for social studies and library/media. Teachers doing the review examined assessments, textbook usage, and alignment to Michigan Department of Education requirements. Both curricula are still under development, as is the curriculum for science and secondary business.



District wide professional development is part of a comprehensive plan that uses teacher choice as well as mandatory training in areas identified by our district professional development team.

## **School Improvement Plan**

The School Improvement Plan includes strategies and objectives that are aligned with the district and school mission. Building wide professional learning communities focus on student progress monitoring and data analysis, which drives instruction and reflects our emphasis on differentiating instruction for all students.

### **School Wide Focus for the 2014-15 School Year**

1. To improve student reading, writing, math, science, and social studies skills
  - Teachers will utilize data collaboratively as Professional Learning Communities to ensure instruction is individualized for all students across all subject areas.
2. To enhance academic support for all students by differentiating instruction to accommodate each child's readiness, interest and learning style.
  - Teachers will identify a specified Response To Intervention (RTI) block of time daily for to work with students on specific areas of need.
3. To help children develop respectful, responsible, and safe behaviors.
  - School-wide Positive Behavior Supports will be integrated throughout the curriculum utilizing the FISH Philosophy.

Kerby Elementary is dedicated to providing a high quality education to all students. We work collaboratively with parents, teachers and community members to ensure students are provided with a variety of opportunities for learning and growth throughout the school year.
