Directions: Create a standing cube that is representative of one of the colonial regions (New England Colonies, Mid-Atlantic/Middle Colonies, or Southern Colonies).

You will use the textbooks in the classroom for research in addition to notes from discussion. You must research the regions and fill out the note chart before you begin to create the cube!

Your cube needs to contain:

___ a cover/title page

___ a side on the natural resources and economy of the region (these things will be connected)

___ a side on colonial roles (what was it like for people of different backgrounds in that region)

___ an advertisement side for something one might use or participate in for that region.
