Kennedy Profile in Courage Essay Contest	<p>The contest is open to United States high school students in grades nine through twelve attending public, private, parochial, or home schools. The winner of the competitive annual contest is awarded a \$10,000 prize and is invited to accept the award at the Profile in Courage Award ceremony hosted each May by Caroline Kennedy at the Kennedy Presidential Library and Museum in Boston. The student's nominating teacher receives a John F. Kennedy Public Service Grant in the amount of \$500 and is also invited to attend the Profile in Courage Award ceremony. A second place winner receives \$1,000 and up to five finalists each receive \$500. Past winners and finalists are not eligible to participate. Employees of John Hancock Financial Services and members of their families are not eligible to participate.</p> <p>Essays can be no more than 1,000 words. Citations and bibliography are not included in the word count. Essays must describe an act of political courage by a U.S. elected official that occurred during or after 1956, the publication date of Profiles in Courage.
