- Pass Credit (G) or No Credit (N) does not affect GPA
- Colleges are looking for an upward trend
- There are no test scores on transcript

Preliminary SAT®/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test

SAT

- Digital Adaptive testing
- 2 sections
 - Reading & Writing
 - Math
- Length: 2 hr 14 min
- Math through Alg II/Trig included
- May use a calculator on ALL of the test
- Cost: \$68 (fee waivers for eligible students)

Avg Nat'l Score: 1050
Avg MI Score: 959

ACT

- Not required but an option
- Register online
- Plan ahead.
- www.actstudent.org

SAT

- State required test will be free
- National testing (Saturday)
 - Register online
 - Plan ahead
- Carefully review prospective college application requirements

Finding the right fit...

- Selecting a college is *not* about getting into the most prestigious school. It is about finding the one that is *right for YOU*!
- Start by thinking about what you are looking for in your college experience
- Visit them (literally and virtually)
- Let them visit you (Naviance Rep Visits)

Consider:



- "**Likely**" likelihood of getting into that school seem *fairly certain:*
 - GPA & SAT/ACT are above or high above the average admit rate for that school

"<u>**Target**</u>" likelihood of getting into that school seem *probable:*

- GPA & SAT/ACT on par with the average admit rate for that school
- "**<u>Reach</u>**" likelihood of getting into that school are *uncertain*:
 - GPA .2 or further below school's average admit
 - ACT 2 points below average admit (SAT?)
 - ANY school with admit rate below 20%

NCAA Divisions I & II



• Consult the NCAA Freshman **Eligibility Standards Quick** <u>Reference Sheet</u> on the website ACT and SAT scores must be sent directly to NCAA from the testing agency.

• NCAA's SAT/ACT code is 9999.

NCAA Eligibility and Requirements

To be considered qualified for playing sports in a Division 1 or 2 collegiate level:

- Graduate from high school
- Complete a core curriculum:
- Earn an academic GPA and ACT or SAT score consistent with NCAA requirements
- Register online (<u>EligibilityCenter.org</u>)
- **be aware of Film Lit **

**This will only estimate how much you would get through the FAFSA from the government. Colleges may give <u>additional</u> funding based on your FAFSA information. You won't be able to estimate this. This information will come with your award letter in January of senior year. Colleges determine Work Study.

College - Automatic (GPA/test scores)

Google a college name + "scholarships" and check out your college's automatic scholarships based on GPA and test scores

Junior Year Checklist (aka...What do I really Need to Do This Year)

- Begin (or continue) career/college match search Use Naviance
- Meet with college reps & visit schools
- Make a Winter/Spring "Junior Meeting" appointment with counselor (may want to bring parent)
- Plan for and Take College Entrance Exams
- Plan a curriculum that challenges you but keep a balance in your life
- Eat healthfully, sleep regularly, and exercise your mind and body to support physical and mental health
- Preview college apps
