- Instructional Coaches
- Co-Taught Classes to provide support in Literacy and Math
- Class Size Reduction

- Lexia Powerup and MAP Accelerator Subscriptions
- SEL Support Additional Social Workers, Dean of Students at North HS

## To help provide these supports and interventions, the GPPSS plans to utilize 98c funding to support the following program:

## **Instructional Coaches**

Instructional coaches are being trained to work with teachers on setting student centered goals tied to the implementation of research based instructional strategies in the classroom. Goals will target increasing student achievement, student engagement, and implementation of teaching strategies with fidelity. We will measure the success of our coaching initiative by tracking the number of teachers receiving coaching services as well as the success of student

centered goals being measured at the end of each coaching cycle. The budget for our Instructional Coaching initiative is:
