## 5.6 Multiplying Fractions by Whole Numbers

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
Recall that multiplication by a whole number can be represented as repeated addition. For example,  $4 \cdot 5 = 5 + 5 + 5 + 5 + 5$ . You can multiply a whole number by a fraction using the same method.  $3 \cdot \frac{1}{4} = \frac{1}{4} + \frac{1}{4} + \frac{1}{4} = \frac{3}{4}$ There is another way to multiply with fractions. Remember that a whole number can be written as an improper fraction with 1 in the denominator. So  $3 = \frac{3}{1}$ .  $\frac{3}{1} \cdot \frac{1}{4} = \frac{3 \cdot 1}{1 \cdot 4} = \frac{3}{4} \leftarrow \frac{\text{Multiply numerators}}{\text{Multiply denominators}}$





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
Evaluate 3x for each value of x. Write each answer in simplest form.

$$\frac{3}{1} \cdot \frac{4}{7} = \frac{12}{7}$$

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There are 25 students in the music club. Of those students,  $\frac{3}{5}$  are also in the band. How many music club students are in the band?


To find  $\frac{3}{5}$  of 25, multiply.



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There are 18 saltwater fish in the aquarium. Of those fish,  $\frac{2}{3}$  are blue. How many fish in the aquarium are blue?

To find  $\frac{2}{3}$  of 18, multiply.



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
