The objective of this meeting was to review the **Michigan Model's Growing Up and Staying Healthy, Understanding HIV and Other STI'S.**, for potential inclusion in the middle school program. This program is used by the majority of middle schools in Michigan. The group was divided into 4 sub-groups to review Lessons 1, 2, 3, 5, 7, and 8.

Discussion centered primarily on content, age appropriateness, and ease of implementation into our program, given the time frame of the middle school program.

Lesson VI:	Identifying and Refusing Trouble Situations	Approved for Grade 7
Lesson VII:	Avoiding and Escaping Risk Situations	Approved for Grade 8
Lesson VIII:	Some Day But Not Now	Approved for Grade 8

Where do we go from here?

In the fall, 2015, an open forum will be held for parents to review materials and ask questions.

The proposed changes will go before the EPLC in October for approval.

The Board of Education will review and approve curriculum changes/additions at their November meeting for implementation in the 2016 middle school reproductive health classes.
